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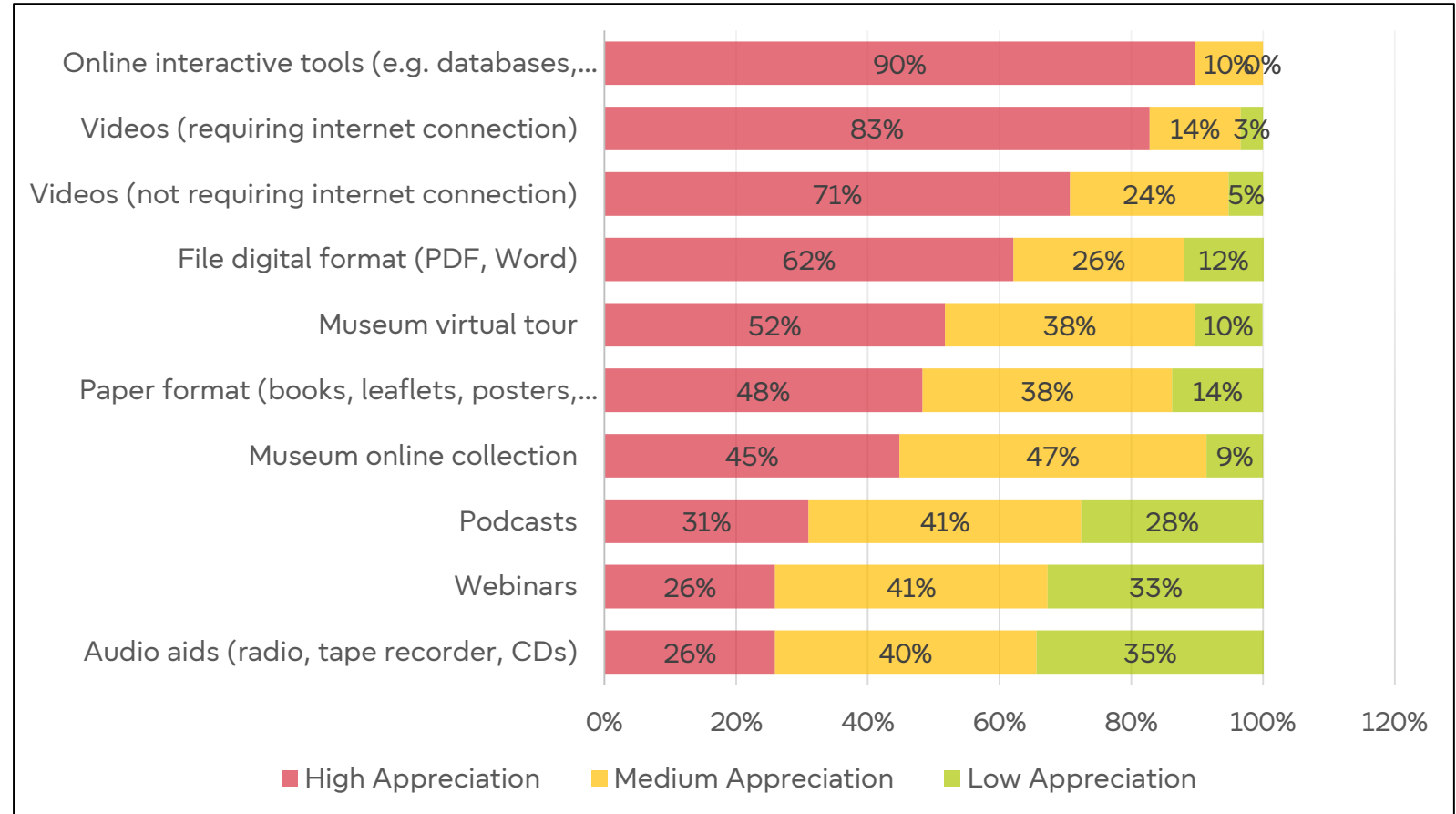


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Zentrale Erkenntnisse der Bedarfserhebung

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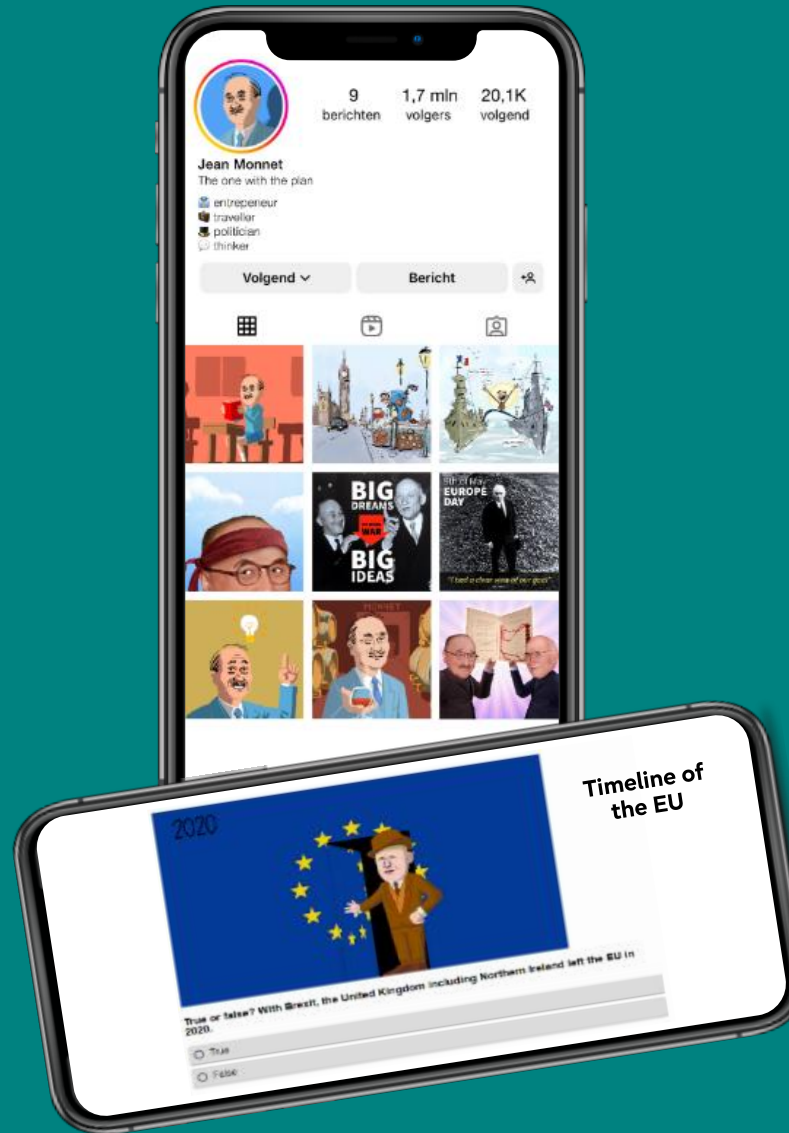

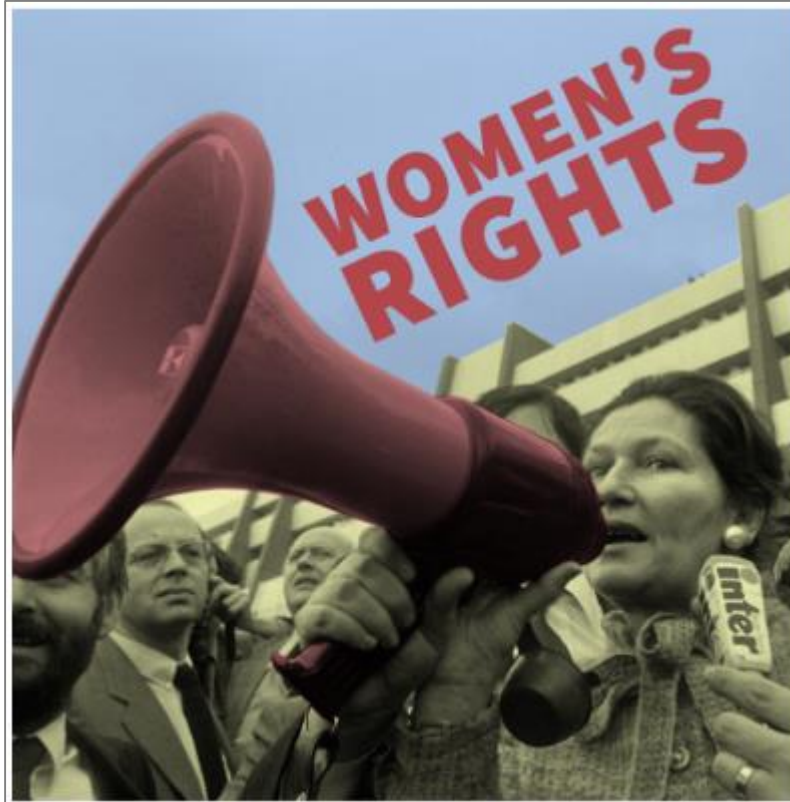

The battle for reproductive rights was fierce and fraught with opposition, but I refused to back down. In 1975, thanks to my resilience and the unwavering support of my allies, the law was passed, forever known as the Loi Veil (the Veil Law). It was a watershed moment for women's rights in France, a testament to the power of perseverance and collective action. And though the road ahead was long and arduous, I remained undeterred in my pursuit of equality and justice for all.

🌟 In 1981, I made history by becoming the first woman to receive both the Louise Weiss Prize and the Charlemagne Prize 🏆 It was a huge honour, especially given my history with Louise. 🇫🇷 In 2008, I was thrilled to join the Académie française, as the 6th woman ever to ever receive such an honour. 🗡️ When I received my ceremonial sword, I had three important things engraved on it: my Auschwitz tattoo number (78651); the motto of the French Republic (Liberty, Equality, Fraternity); and the European Union motto (United in Diversity).

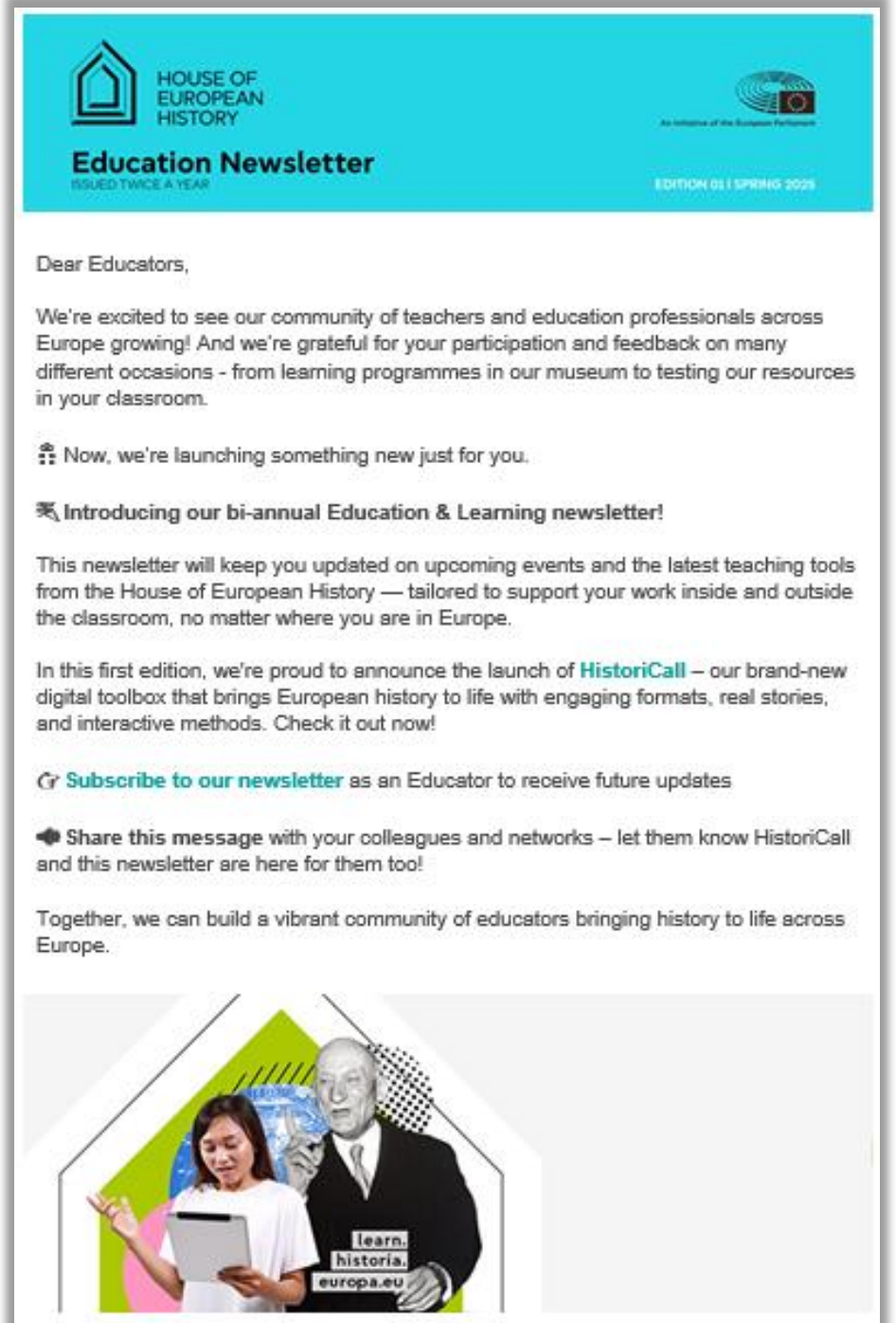
